Eligibility rules for administrative consideration:

- 1. Complaints and requests for review of library materials must be first presented to the Library Director for discussion and written response.
- 2. Requestor must be an adult patron with a Cook Memorial Library card that has been active for more than three months
- 3. Requests from groups or organizations will not be considered.
- 4. Each form can only be used for a single title.
- 5. A maximum of ONE (1) request per month per person will be considered. Requests will be dismissed if submitted within 30 days of a prior request.
- A fee may be required for reconsideration of more than three requests in twelve months.
- 7. Materials reviewed and retained are exempt from reconsideration again for a period of three years.
- 8. All questions in this form require responses. Incomplete requests will be denied.
